CIRCULAR:-

A reference is invited to the syllabi relating to the Bachelor of Pharmacy (B.Pharm.) degree course <u>vide</u> this office Circular No.UG/193 of 2016-17, dated 3rd December, 2016 and the Principals of affiliated Colleges in Pharmacy are hereby informed that the recommendations made by Ad-hoc Board of Studies in Pharmacy at its meeting held on 7th February, 2017 has been accepted by the Academic Council at its meeting held on 31st May, 2017 <u>vide</u> item No. 4.2 and that in accordance therewith, the syllabus has been revised as per (CBCS) for Bachelor of Pharmacy (Sem. I to IV). Further it is also <u>resolved</u> that, the students who entered the B. Pharm. Programme in year 2015-16 under the CBSGS system and are now rejoining the B. Pharm. Programme after a one year drop will not have to take the Physical Pharmacy I (Theory and Lab) offered in semester – III. The students however will have to take Dispensing and Community Pharmacy I (Theory and Lab) that is part of Sem. I of CBCS Syllabus, when they renter the B.Pharm. Programme and in their first odd Semester i.e. Semester – III.

It is further <u>resolved</u> that, the students who entered the B.Pharm. Program in year 2015-16 under the CBSGS and are now rejoining the B.Pharm. Program after a one year drop will not have to take Physical Pharmacy II (Theory and Lab) and Pharmaceutics - I (Theory and Lab) that are part of CBCS syllabus and offered in semester IV. The students however will not to take Biochemistry! (Theory and Lab), Pharmacognosy I (Theory and Lab), and Hospital Pharmacy and Drug Store Management (Theory) all of which that are part of Sem II of CBCS Syllabus, when they enter the B.Pharm. Programme and in their first even Semester i.e. Semester IV.

It is also be noted that, these students will be allowed to carry forward these courses till the end of semester VIII of the B.Pharm. Programme. However, the students will not be eligible to get course completion certificate i.e. degree and CGPA until these courses are successfully cleared. Further, these courses shall not be taken into account while applying ATKT rules as applicable to the other courses of the CBCS B.Pharm. Program.

The same is available on the University's website (www.mu.ac.in) and the same has been brought into force with effect from the academic year 2017-18, accordingly.
