

- The candidate should have appeared in GPAT (Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test)-2024 Exam.

- The candidate should be an Indian National.
- Passed HSC or its equivalent examination with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects along with one of the Mathematics or Biology and obtained at least 45% marks (at least 40% marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories, Economically Weaker Section and Persons with Disability belonging only to Maharashtra State) in the above subjects taken together;
- The candidate should have appeared in all the subjects in MHT-CET 2024 and obtain nonzero score in MHT-CET-2024

ALL INDIA CANDIDATURE CANDIDATES

- The candidate should be an Indian National.
- Passed HSC or its equivalent examination with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects along with one of the Mathematics or Biology and obtained at least 45% marks (at least 40% marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories, Economically Weaker Section and Persons with Disability belonging only to Maharashtra State) in the above subjects taken together;
- The candidate should obtain non-zero positive score in NEET-2024 or the candidate should have appeared in all the subjects in MHT-CET-2024.



ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA OF CANDIDATES (DIRECT SECOND YEAR B. PHARM)

FOR MAHARASHTRA STATE CANDIDATURE CANDIDATE

- The Candidate should be an Indian National.
- Passed Diploma Course in Pharmacy with at least 45% marks (at least 40% marks in case of candidates of Backward class categories and Persons with disability belonging to Maharashtra State only) from an All India Council for Technical Education or Pharmacy Council of India or Central or State Government approved Institution or its equivalent.
- Candidates passing Diploma in Pharmacy from Institution not approved by AICTE/PCI are not
 eligible and therefore shall not have any claim on Admission. The merit list shall be prepared
 on the basis of marks obtained by the Candidate on the basis of which Diploma is awarded by
 the examining authority
- Merit of the applicants shall be determined according to the Rule-8 mentioned in the "Information brochure of academic year 2024-25 for B. Pharm direct second year admission, Government of Maharashtra, State Common Entrance Test Cell".



ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO FIRST YEAR D. PHARM

- The candidate should be an Indian National;
- Passed the HSC with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects along with one of the subjects Mathematics or Biology (Botany and Zoology)
- Other than Maharashtra State Candidates shall be eligible for Institution quota only.

RULES & REGULATION

- Attendance Compliance on part of the Student
- Normally 100 % attendance is expected. But it can be condoned up to a maximum of 25 % covering student's sickness and other genuine causes. If the attendance is not 75% of actual study days and absence of 25 % is not supported with valid reasons, the term will not be granted to these students and they will not therefore be allowed to appear in the University Examination or Examinations conducted on behalf of the University (University of Mumbai ordinances No. 0.6086). It should also be noted by the students, that the certification of the Term is subject wise for each Term.
- Absence on medical ground for 3 days or more should be supported by medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner.
- If the Term is not granted, the student will have to take re-admission for the same Term next year, by paying the requisite fees.
- In order to monitor the attendance, percentage attendance will be assessed for each student in
- each subject at the end of each month and parents of the students having poor attendance will be informed and if necessary called upon to meet the college authorities.

GENERAL INSTITUTE REGULATIONS

- Admission of a candidate will be treated as confirmed only after receiving the enrollment/Final
 eligibility certificate (if applicable) from the University of Mumbai and after the final approval of
 DTE and Admission regulating authority (ARA), Government of Maharashtra.
- If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied by the candidate in connection with his or her admission is later at any time, found to be false or incorrect, his or her admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and he or she may be expelled from the college by the Principal. An appeal against the order of expulsion, however, may be preferred within 7 days to the Director of Technical Education, Maharashtra State, Mumbai, whose decision in such cases will be final.
- Students have to pay the difference in the Tution/ Development Fees, if any, within ten days of announcement made by the fees regulating authority, Government of Maharashtra.

LIBRARY RULES

- Books shall be issued from Home Issue Section and should be returned on or before the due date mentioned on the date slip.
- In case, the book is not returned by the due date, the student shall pay fine.
 The due date can be extended in specific cases with the approval of the librarian.
- Reference books will not be issued for home reading. They are only for referring in the library, and
- should be handled carefully.



- Students must be in their classes in time. Late comers may not be allowed to enter the classes.
- Students must do nothing either inside or outside the Institute that will in any way interfere with its orderly administration and discipline. They should not communicate any information or write anything about the Institute to the press without the written permission of the Principal.
- Students are liable to lose their term for disobedience, misconduct, misbehaviour or for any act of
- indiscipline.
 - Use of mobile Phones, Pagers, Walkman, airdopes etc. in the institute premises is strictly
- prohibited.
- Students will not misbehave in any manner anywhere in the institute campus nor wear any improper dress while in the institute and its premises and would maintain decent behaviour and shall uphold the dignity of the institute wherever he/she may be.
- All the students are supposed to carry their Identity Card with them when they are in the college. I
- - cards may be checked at any time, especially at the entrance. The students will not be permitted to loiter in the institute on holidays, unless they have been specially called.
 - Students should not scribble anything on the walls, furniture etc. Strict action will be taken against the student indulging in such practices and if the student indulging in such practices is not
- identified the whole class will pay to compensate for the loss. Breakage of furniture will be treated in the same manner.



REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO EXAMINATION OF M. PHARM COURSE

- A candidate to be eligible for the Degree of Master of Pharmacy will be required to pass Semester I, II, III & IV.
- Internal exams are conducted for 25 and 50 marks for theory and practicals respectively in First year of program. At the end of the term an examination of 75 marks for theory course and 100 marks for practical will be conducted.
- Semester III has a total 175 marks. It includes one non-university subject (Research Methodology and Biostatistics), Journal Club and Discussion/presentation (Proposal Presentation).

However, his/her marks of the Internal Assessment shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.



REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO EXAMINATION OF B. PHARM. DEGREE COURSE

- A candidate to be eligible for the Degree of Bachelor of Pharmacy will be required to pass Semester I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII & VIII.
- Internal exams are conducted for 25 and 15 marks for theory and practicals respectively. At the end of the term an examination of 75 marks for theory course and 35 marks for Practical will be conducted.
- Candidate shall be declared PASS and eligible for getting grade in a course of B.Pharm. program if he/she secures at least 50% marks in that particular course including internal assessment.



CARRY FORWARD OF MARKS

In case a student fails to secure the minimum 50% in any Theory or Practical course, then he/she shall reappear for the end semester examination of that course. However his/her marks of the Internal Assessment shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing.

PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACTION AGAINST RAGGING

Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999 which is in effect from 15thMay 1999 has the following provisions for Action against Ragging. Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited. Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and / or penalty which may extend to ten thousand rupees. Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such students shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal. Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution complaints, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of the education institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is situated, for further action. Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is found that there is no substance, prima facie, in the complaint received; he/she shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant. The decision of the head of the educational institution shall be final. If the head of the educational institution fails or neglects to act in the manner specfied in section "d" above when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section "b" above

- It is mandatory as per the Hon. Supreme Court & UGC/AICTE Regulations that all students fill in an Anti Ragging Affidavit, each year. Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 887 of 2009, passed the judgment wherein guidelines were issued for setting up of a Central Crisis Hotline and AntiRagging database. To make the process easy MHRD has developed an ON LINE Facility. Affidavits can be filled ON LINE at at www.antiragging.in OR www.ugc.gov.in.
- This portal contains Affidavits confirmed by each student and their parents or guardians, which will then be stored electronically and will contain the details of each student, record of registered complaints received and the status of the action taken.


